- Austin’s Heating/Ventilation Industry leaders drove to San Antonio (~100 miles) for meetings of ASHVE (American Society Heating & Ventilating Engineers).

October 1955 Proposed:

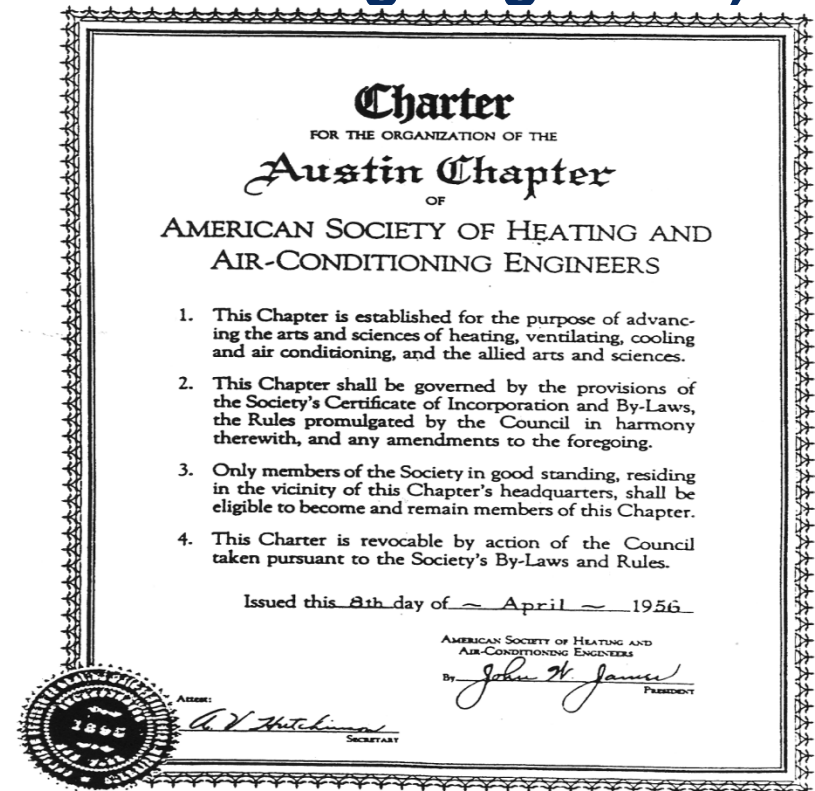

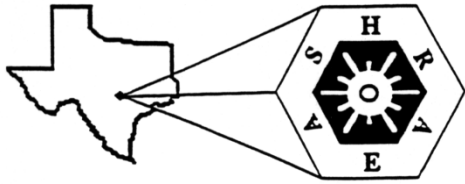
April 1956:

“The Austin Register”

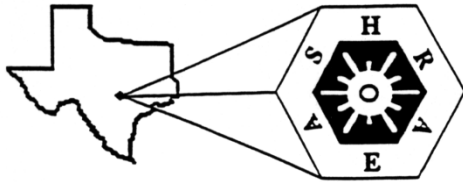




AUSTIN ASHRAE

1956 - 1960:

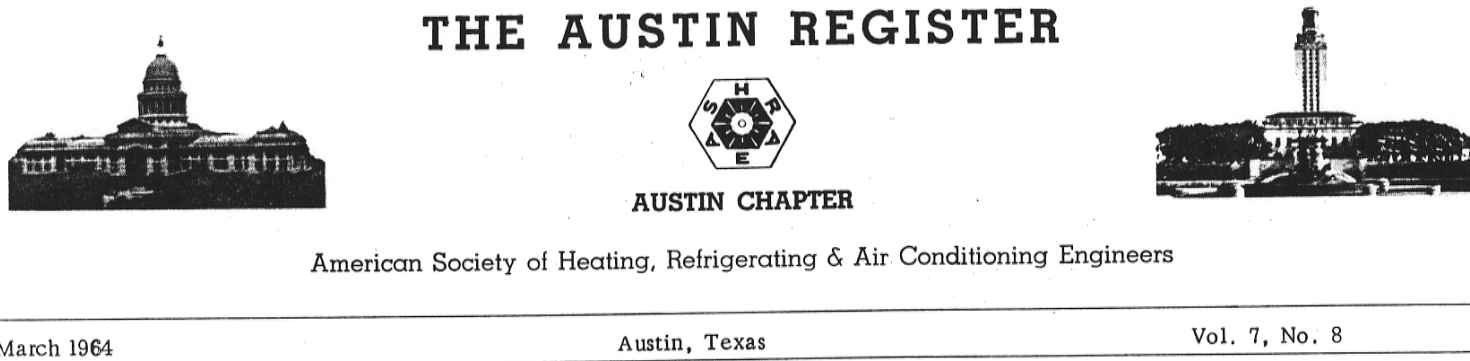
- **Mr. James Rea was Secretary and designed and wrote the first Austin Register newsletter.**
- **The Austin Register was printed front & back on 11x14 paper, & folded as “business envelope” mailer.**
- **Cost to mail a 1958 newsletter was two (2) cents.**
- **Chapter meal was usually chicken fried steak complete with salad, desert, coffee or tea at \$1.75.**
- **Our first President was B. Segall, Jr.**
- **Meetings lasted from the 6:00 p.m. Social Hour to the 10:00 p.m. +/- Adjournment.**

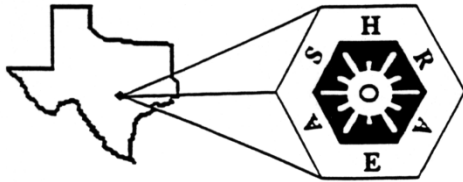


AUSTIN ASHRAE

1960 - 1970:

- The Austin Register's format began to change slightly due to available technology and the creativity and initiative of the Newsletter Editors.
- Around 1964, since Austin was the home of the Capitol and the University of Texas, the newsletter began appearing with a header with pictures of both

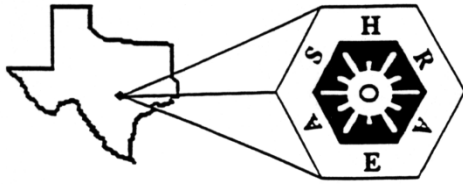




AUSTIN ASHRAE

1960 – 1970, continued:

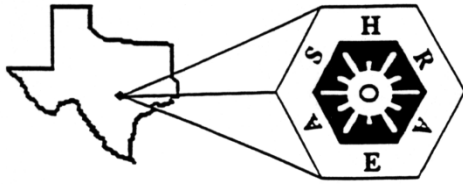
- The Register was still printed front and back, and folded to be mailed at a cost of six (6) cents by the end of the decade - 1969.
- A complete chapter meal cost \$2.50.
- Meetings began adjourning earlier at 9:00 p.m. or so.
- The Chapter added a President-Elect position to have five (5) Officers, but still only had two (2) BOGs.
 - Members serving: Frank Gerling, Eddie Bloomquist, William Milstead, Brooks Porter Jr., William Fairchild, Atwell Lagow, and Les Ward.
- In 1964, the Chapter Treasury held \$330.
- By 1969, the Chapter was 13 years old.



AUSTIN ASHRAE

1970 - 1980:

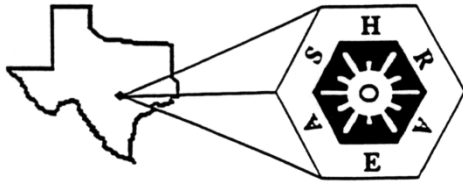
- In this decade, the Chapter Officer Positions included Newsletter Editor (6 total). The immediate Past President was added to the BOG to make 3 total.
- At some point a technical session was incorporated at the monthly meeting, now starting at 5:30 p.m. and adjourning by 8:30 p.m. Attendance averaged 30-35.
- The Austin Register still looked the same and cost 10 cents to mail until the late 1970's when it went to 13¢.
- By March 20, 1975; the Chapter was nearly 20 years old and meals at Sid's Restaurant cost \$5.00.
- In 1977, the Chapter Treasury held \$2,563, but costs were rising.



AUSTIN ASHRAE

1980 – 1990, continued:

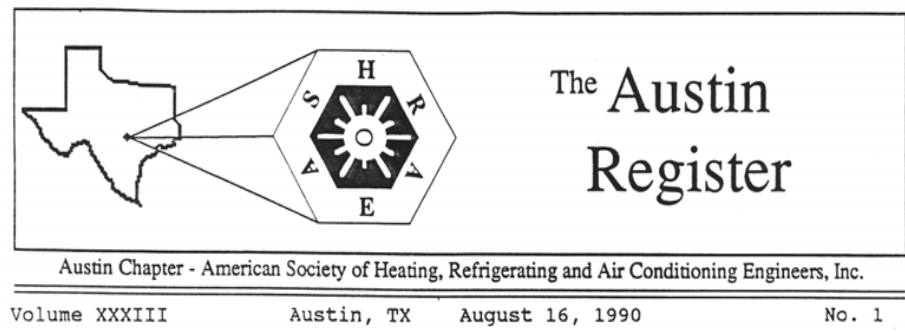
- In 1984, the Chapter Newsletter incorporated the State of Texas and expanded the ASHRAE symbol coming out of a star to represent Austin (see header).
- During May of that Society Year of 1984-1985, the Austin Chapter won the Region VIII Golden Gavel for the first time in its history under Larry Bloomquist.
- Meetings switched to Hotels & meals cost \$12.00.
- By 1987 the addition of pictures and other inserts began in the Newsletter. Mailing costs were skyrocketing to 20 cents.
- Editing software began to allow Editors to be more creative.

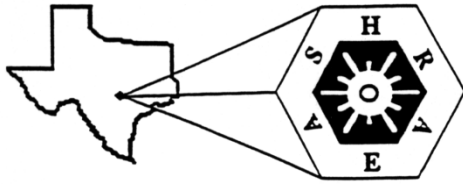


AUSTIN ASHRAE

1980 - 1990:

- By President Ron Jackson's year (1987-1988), adding pictures and other inserts in the Newsletter was still pretty crude.
- President Jackson set a historical precedent by being the first to include a Presidential picture on the front page of the newsletter, albeit a hand drawn caricature.



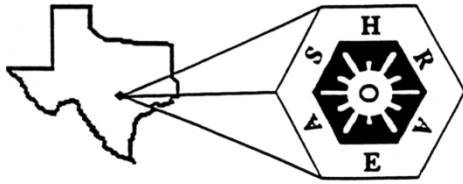


AUSTIN ASHRAE

1990 - 2000:

- By the early 1990's, Presidential photos on the front page of the Newsletter became a requirement.
- The decade started with Steve Jaeger as the first Austin Chapter member to serve twice as President.
- Society year 1993-1994, saw Austin with our first, and only, female President – Gloria Hawkins.
- 1996: The Chapter celebrated its 40th Anniversary
- The Austin Register was advancing technologically and including helpful websites within.

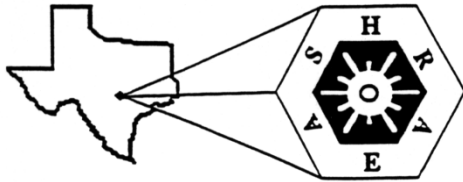




AUSTIN ASHRAE

1990 – 2000, continued:

- Chapter's Research goals reached \$20,000+**
- By the mid-1990's, Chapter meetings continued at Hotels where meals now cost \$15.00.**
- Mailing the newsletter cost thirty-two (32) cents.**
- Membership attendance averaged 40 to 45 attendees.**
- 1996-1997, Chapter Historical archives were formed in City of Austin's History Center where they remain today and are added to periodically.**
- The Austin Chapter started a web-site.**
- Pictures now became digital and inserted in the Austin Register more easily than the old B&W efforts.**



AUSTIN ASHRAE

1990 – 2000, continued:

- Chapter Presidents routinely asked for and received **Proclamations for Engineer's Week. The one to the right is from Governor George Bush.**
- The Chapter had five Officers and four BOG members, and the Committee Chairs had expanded to seventeen (17).
- Membership attendance at meetings was averaging about 40 to 45.


Texas is home to more engineers than any other state in our country. I urge Texans to recognize the importance of engineers in our lives and the vital roles they play in preparing for our future.

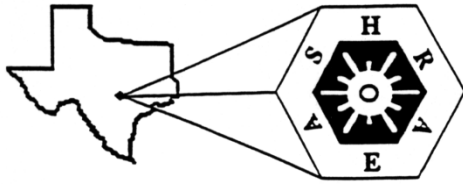

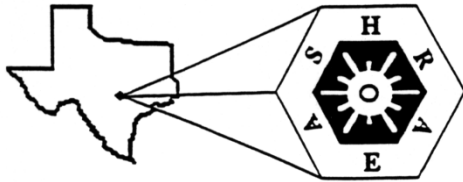

AUSTIN ASHRAE

2000 - 2005:

- **By 2001, the Austin Chapter & Register had gone “high-tech”. The Register was electronically delivered via email. Digital pictures are an integral part of the Newsletter.**
- **During Society Year 2003-2004, under President Jim Ruth, the Chapter received the “High 5 Award” for the most dollars contributed at \$33,838 and through contributions by 91 different organizations.**
- **Meal prices were \$20.00, and it cost 37 cents to mail the newsletters not sent by email.**

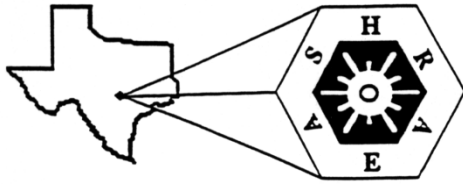


AUSTIN ASHRAE

2006 - 2009: Developed more Chapter skills

- All the Newsletters and other pertinent information began being posted to our Chapter's website.
- The Chapter celebrated its 50th Anniversary in 2006.
- Meal prices were \$25.00 and it cost more than 40 cents to mail the newsletter, if not delivered by email.
- The Chapter began using E-vite to send out monthly reminders and to achieve head counts.

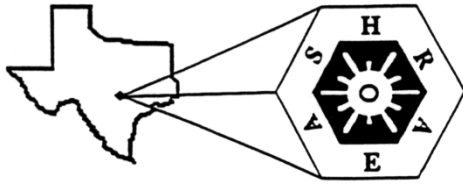
2010 - Present:

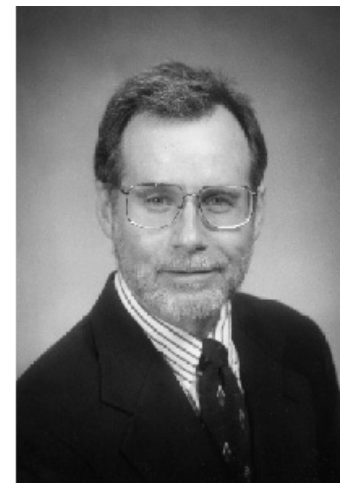

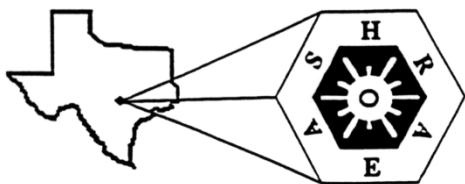


AUSTIN ASHRAE

 - **Bill was a dedicated member of the local engineering community, and involved in other professional associations such as the Texas Association of Healthcare Facility Managers.**





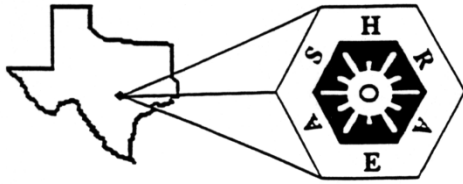

- **He passed away on April 8, 2007.**



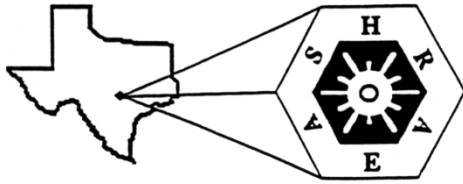
- **Charles was a graduate of The University of Texas at Austin.**

In Memorial Continued:

- **Mr. Bernard Segall, Jr. (Austin Chapter’s 1st President 1956-57) known to everyone as “B”, was born September 29, 1919 in Beaumont, Texas, and passed away on November 3, 2007.**
 - **B lived in Shreveport, Louisiana where he grew up prior to going to Georgia Tech for a Mechanical Engineering degree and commission in the Army Air Corps.**
 - **B eventually ended up in Austin, Texas, and established his own engineering firm and soon became the premier firm in the heating and ventilation industry.**
 - **“B” had the distinction of being involved with the La Commercial which was the first centrally air-conditioned building in Mexico City.**

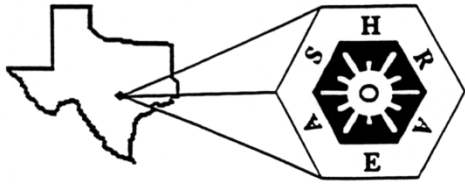
